Description of how your agency will use these Reserve funds for the support and development of career pathways for career and technical education students.

One of our first goals is to give CTE teachers resources and training to meet the needs of our teachers with instructional supports and helps in the classroom. One of the main requests we heard from school-based stakeholders was that teachers need support for their classrooms in training and preparing students for industry certifications to meet our local workforce needs. It is our hopes to use these funds to help our programs be better able to help students for work. We hope to use some of the funds to bring teachers of each program together to work toward writing clear programs of study. We plan to continue writing programs of studies while joining with local postsecondary institutions to link further job training either after high school, or as dual enrollment students. To do this, teacher classrooms will need covered with someone who can continue instruction. This can be accomplished with classroom paraprofessionals and substitutes.

Another goal of our work is to develop opportunities for our CTE students to participate in work-based learning experiences. Standards with emphasis of business planning and entrepreneurial development will be unpacked with better lessons developed and materials acquired.

• Description of how the results of the comprehensive local needs assessment informed the selection of the specific career and technical education programs and activities selected to be funded with this grant.

The input of the members and stakeholders of our CLNA were valuable in driving funding for programs. The stakeholders helped us take a closer look at jobs that were needed in and around our area and what programs helped produce those jobs. Standards for each program were analyzed and strengths/weaknesses of current programs were looked at for marketing or improvement. The goals and findings of the CLNA will help drive the direction of our CTE programs as well as future CLNA stakeholder meetings. One program our school-based

stakeholders had shared with us that they felt needed to be added was Landscape Operations.

Our labor market data supported this request, so we knew we needed to start this program.

• Description of the CTE services and activities that will be offered during the program year.

The Jackson County School District Career, Technical, and Adult Education Department (CTAE) continues to enjoy a close partnership with the Region 3 Workforce Development Board, Chipola College, and Florida Panhandle Technical College to identify high-wage occupations and provide programs to support the same. JCSD CTAE and CareerSource Chipola work with local employers to identify training needed to help the existing workforce adjust to changes in technology or standards. The CTAE Department works with Chipola and Florida Panhandle Technical College to develop and strengthen Programs of Study for students to continue a path to postsecondary education.

The funds from this grant helps provide resources to help create or enhance CTE programs. Funds will be used to pay for a paraprofessional to be used in classrooms to close achievement gaps in special population students and to help teachers when they need to leave the classroom for PD and to meet with industry stakeholders.

The department also helps with sending CTE teachers to trainings and activities improve their professional development opportunities. The JCSD CTAE Department works regularly with business and industry partners to provide student internships and co-op opportunities to its students. We have developed many partnerships that provide wonderful placement opportunities for our students.

Additionally, district and school administration will continue to place a high emphasis on industry certification. Teachers will review the curriculum alignment associated with their course frameworks and will continue to implement rigorous reading standards as outlined in Just Read Florida academic standards. Such rigor will enable and empower CTE students to enter the workforce as industry certified and highly skilled employees. The Jackson County School District is committed to providing resources that will allow our students to reach their highest academic achievement while providing seamless articulation to a post-secondary certificate or degree program. These interventions will result in a skilled workforce that can provide quality, efficient services. Jackson County will use Perkins funding to address reading, math and science initiatives and the Strategic Imperatives of the Florida Department of Education.
