Child Trafficking Prevention Education Curriculum Overview

1. In an effort to build resiliency among our youth and to foster safe environments conducive to student learning, the Jackson County School District will require that all students in Grades K-5 complete instruction each year with regards to Child Trafficking prevention and awareness. The curriculum will include Common Core and National Health Education Standards through the Child Safety Matters program to address Child Trafficking prevention and awareness, as required by the State Board of Education. The Monique Burr Foundation for Children Prevention Education Program is an evidence-based and evidence-informed, comprehensive prevention program that educates and empowers children and teens with universal strategies and Safety Rules to prevent, recognize, and respond appropriately to the four types of child abuse (physical, emotional, sexual, and neglect), exploitation, bullying, cyberbullying, and digital dangers.

Instructional Delivery

1. The Child Trafficking prevention and awareness education will be delivered by Physical Education/Wheel school based instructional staff that are trained by The Monique Burr Foundation to present the Child Safety Matters program effectively by following approved policies, procedures, and evidence-based practices. The curriculum meets the ruling requirement of instruction with course specification per grade that is developmentally appropriate. Instruction will be delivered in the following courses:

Professional Qualifications

- 1. The Physical Education/Wheel instructional staff are district employed staff that are designated to assist Jackson County School District in meeting the Child Trafficking prevention and awareness state mandate. The instructional staff have been trained by the Monique Burr Foundation to present the Child Safety Matters program effectively by following approved policies, procedures, and evidence-based practices. The instructor/s must have a Bachelor's Degree and have Florida Educator certification with Florida Department of Education.
- 2. Oversight and implementation of the Child Trafficking prevention and awareness curriculum will be conducted by the Director of Safety, Director of K-12 Programs and MIS, and the Mental Health Administrator for Jackson County School District. The combined qualifications of the three staff are as follows:
 - A. Certified School Safety Specialist
 - B. Fortify FL Administrator
 - C. Youth Mental Health First Aid Trainer
 - D. District Threat Management Coordinators
 - E. Threat Assessment Trainer (Dewey Cornell Model)
 - F. Florida Department of Health Licensed Mental Health Counselor #MH 24858
 - G. Florida Department of Education Professional Licensure # 706231
 - H. Florida Department of Education Professional Licensure # 740806
 - I. Florida Department of Education Professional Licensure # 716970

Materials and Resources

1. The Jackson County School District has chosen to work in cooperation with the Monique Burr Foundation to provide the Child Safety Matters program instruction to all Kindergarten through fifth grade students. The Child Safety Matters curriculum meets the ruling requirement of instruction, as required by the State Board of Education, with Child Trafficking prevention and awareness course specification per grade that is developmentally appropriate and skill building, which advances each year with student progression.

Data Tracking & Reporting

- 1. The Director of K-12 Programs and MIS for Jackson County School District will provide a report to the Commissioner of Education by July 1st of each year verifying completion of instruction.
- 2. The Director of Safety, Director of K-12 Programs and MIS, and the Mental Health Administrator for Jackson County School District will monitor completion of the Child Safety Matters instruction, to meet the requirement of Child Trafficking prevention and awareness education for all Kindergarten through 5th grade students, issued by the State Board of Education.
